Quick guide to dataset table

- The database is set out in a spreadsheet style format in which:
 - o all columns or any single column can be searched.
 - the default display is given in reverse entry number order so that new additions will always show at the top of the first page on first opening the table.
 - one or a set of columns can be filtered or sorted in ascending or descending order. Often the most illuminating view can be inspected by sorting a cascade of Main domain → Subdomain 1→ Subdomain 2
- The Source type refers to the different types of scientific journal or other content (Empirical Study, Review/Overview or Theory / Hypothesis etc) to give a rough idea of the sort of information that might be of most interest to users.
- The Citation counts give an indication of potential oversight either because of a
 high count in sources probably not regularly consulted by healthcare professionals or
 by what would seem to be an inappropriately low count in more orthodox biomedical literature. Citation counts clearly cannot be given for non-scientific journal
 sources such as books or websites.
- Any number of records can be selected for export to Word, PDF, Excel, or CSV format files.
